In other news, the Amachi team is continuing to work hard on the AMI (Appalachian Mentoring Initiative)
Grant, a project that is providing mentoring services for young people impacted by opioid misuse and abuse.
We have begun to serve Amachi mentees who have been negatively impacted by substance abuse through matching them with positive mentors and by providing curriculum and conversations centered around opioids.
Additionally, Amachi team member Olivia Martin will lead a group mentoring cohort in Somerset, KY beginning mid-September. We are excited to reach even more young people and their families through this grant!

Kentucky Fatherhood Summit 2019

The inaugural Kentucky Fatherhood Summit hosted by the Commonwealth Center for Fathers and Families is happening on September 27th, 2019 at Griffin Gate Marriott in Lexington. This event is being presented in partnership with the Kentucky Department for Income Support, Prevent Child Abuse Kentucky, and Lexington Leadership Foundation's Fatherhood Initiative.


The summit will provide a collaborative opportunity for social service professionals, academicians, law enforcement agencies, legislators, grassroots non-profits, faith-based organizations, fathers, and the community at large to influence the future of Fatherhood in Kentucky.

The summit will explore the best methods of reaching fathers for the purpose of leveraging their individual experiences and abilities for the betterment of their children, families, and communities. Plenary sessions will discuss the vital role of fathers in healthy childhood development and the prevention of childhood poverty. Breakout session topics will include — Self-Sufficient Fathers, Fatherhood Engagement, Fathers Supporting Children, and Successful Co-Parenting.

Registration for the event is \$25 with scholarships available if needed. The Fatherhood Initiative is excited to be a part of this summit and the statewide efforts promoting healthy and strong fathers and families.
