Letter From Our Chief Executive Officer, Eric Geary

So, while we celebrate God's great accomplishments advancing His reign, the Kingdom reality we long for is both "already... but not yet." More simply, we've got a long way to go to live into the idea we see in Zechariah 8, where the city is a playground not a battleground.

So, what shall we do then?

Well... we press on... we dig in. The Apostle Paul said it this way: "Straining toward what is ahead... press on toward the goal." (Philippians 3).

My hope is that you will review this report and celebrate what He has done over the last 20. Then, my hope is you will put it down, roll up your sleeves, and get ready for the next 20. God still wants to see His Kingdom come in Lexington as it is in Heaven today.

The Prayer Room exists to foster deep connectivity with Jesus and mobilize corporate intercession throughout the Church in Lexington. Situated with close proximity to campus, the ministry of The Prayer Room is set apart for every stream of the Body of Christ to have constant opportunity to enjoy the Lord in relationship with one another.

During a typical week an average of 75-100 people from 25 very diverse congregations visit for prayer and worship in group and individual settings. The atmosphere is multi-generational, multi-ethnic, and extremely broad socio-economically. However, young people, and in particular college students, infuse the space and inform the movement with fresh vitality.

Additionally, The Prayer Room acts as a hub for regional conferences and various ministries.

We hope in the future that intercession and worship arise 24/7/365. Praywith us – that Jesus would be magnified in the earth through the praise, adoration, and prayers of His people – even as He is in heaven right now



Urban Impact exists to enable children and youth to **GROW**, **SUCCEED**, and **LEAD**. We value relationships with these students, as well as with the others who make-up their supportive village. Through holistic programming, we seek to impart skills necessary for youth to overcome the obstacles that exist within their communities.

It is our vision to see young people become leaders within their neighborhoods. For instance, because of years of investment in relationship and commitment to one another, young adults that were once students in our program are now taking on positions of leadership at Woodhill Community Center. This past summer, six out of 10 summer youth helpers were former participants. They're taking the reins of leadership! Middle and high school students also serve in our Read to Succeed Program, alongside some incredible adult leaders. We're seeing students and their families engage in service within their neighborhood. Our Village is growing, and there is still room for you to get involved!

Woodhill Community Center

We recently celebrated our one-year anniversary of occupancy at Woodhill Community Center! The Center has become the hub for our work with elementary, middle and high school youth, offering increased opportunities for Athletics, Arts and Academics.

For example, the Center has connected us with many young people through open gym basketball and, new this year, futsal soccer. Our partnership with the Lexington Tennis Club continues, offering tennis to our elementary students. Summer campers were able to experience soccer and volleyball clinics as well. In partnership with Breckinridge Elementary we offered a creative arts camp, focusing on visual art, dance, music and the spoken word. Local schoolteachers also partnered with us to host a seasonal community market, offering fresh produce to the Woodhill neighborhood. And our afterschool programs offer academic enrichment to elementary, middle and high school students throughout the week.

We are continually grateful for what God has provided through the Woodhill Community Center and the many ways we are able to utilize the space as a vehicle to help Lexington become a city for God!

Fatherhood Initiative

A father's positive involvement in the life of his child, both by direct engagement with the child and positive interaction with the mother, can lead to better child outcomes in multiple areas. The Fatherhood Initiative raises awareness and promotes this notion both locally and statewide. Our goal is to create a culture that encourages and supports fathers in becoming more involved in the lives of their families and the community.

In addition, the Fatherhood Initiative provides direct services to fathers and families. Since 2011 our program has faithfully served nearly 3,000 participants. We have mobilized over 100 committed people of faith and goodwill to provide thousands of hours of fatherhood education and related enrichment activities. Most of these hours occurred within small group sessions held for 12 weeks in locations throughout the city. These groups address real and real-time issues that both custodial and non-custodial fathers experience. Together, men explore how they can learn and grow into the most positive father possible. We believe that as we promote fathers, we will also be promoting the well-being of children, families, and communities.


